

**WISCONSIN STUDENT PROFICIENCY STANDARDS which can be met teaching

This curriculum addresses the following Wisconsin Social Studies Standards:

A. Geography. “Students in Wisconsin will learn about geography through the study of relationships among people, places, and environments.”

B. History. “Students in Wisconsin will learn about the history of Wisconsin, the United States and the world, examining change and continuity over time in order to develop historical perspective, to explain historical relationships, and analyze issues that affect the present and the future.”

C. Political Science and Citizenship. “Students in Wisconsin will learn about political science and acquire the knowledge of political systems necessary for contemporary uses of power, authority and government.”

E. Behavioral Sciences. “Students in Wisconsin will learn about the behavioral sciences by exploring concepts from the discipline of sociology, the study of the interactions among individuals, groups, and institutions; the discipline of psychology, the study of factors that influence individual identity and learning; and the discipline of anthropology, the study of cultures in various times and settings.”
